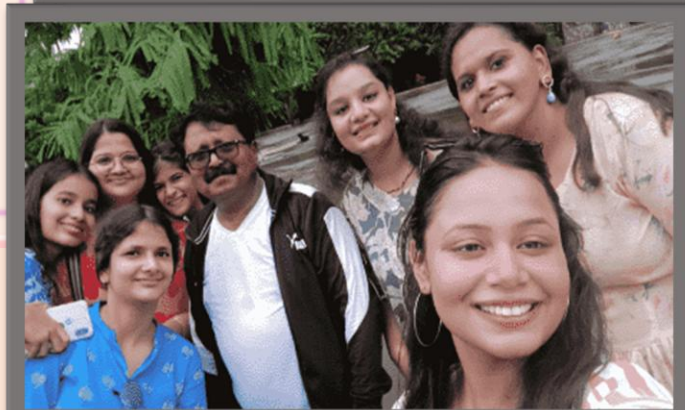
Memories in Motion: Fun-Filled Chandigarh Tour

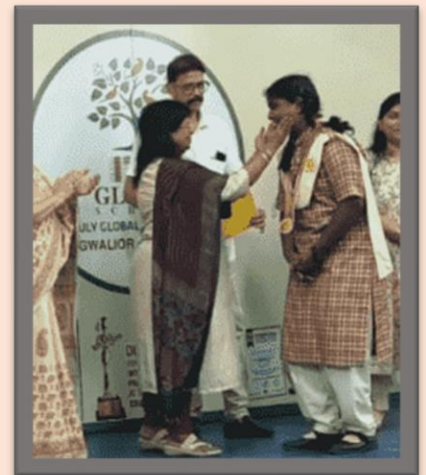
Sahodaya Dance Delight: Carmelites Shine with Grace!
